## **Northwest Danish Association and its Scholarship Fund**

The Northwest Danish Association provides annual scholarships for persons of Danish descent residing in Washington and Oregon. Consideration is also given to those of non-Danish descent who have shown exceptional involvement in the Danish community. Scholarship grants are available to those pursuing college degrees, technical instruction, or career retraining.

The Association has over 90 years of history of Danish community involvement which has led to the availability of funds for scholarships. In 1923 a group of Danes, wishing to provide a home for retired Danes, purchased a 14-room home on five acres in Seattle. On July 12, 1925, The Northwest Danish Old People's Home was dedicated. In the late 1920s, the home was expanded, and the name was changed to The Northwest Danish Home. Forty years later, on July 12, 1970, a newly built 45-bed nursing home was dedicated to the same principle of providing excellent care to the elderly at low cost.

In 1986, the bylaws of The Northwest Danish Home were expanded to include disbursement of funds for other charitable purposes to serve the Danish community. As a result, the Scholarship Fund was established. In 1987, the membership voted to sell the Home and expand its outreach into the Danish community as the Northwest Danish Foundation, a non-profit organization dedicated to engaging the public in Danish cultural activities and offering social services in the Pacific Northwest. In 2008, the name was changed to Northwest Danish Association.

Today, the Association continues to offer its Scholarship Fund to serve Washington and Oregon residents who are part of the Danish community.

**Scholarship Awards**

The Scholarship Committee, composed of members of the Danish community, meets to review applications and select award recipients. Recipients are notified of awards by mail in early July, provided the Scholarship Committee has proof of admission to the recipient's educational institution. The award check to the applicant and educational institution is mailed in August.

**Granting of Scholarship Funds Shall be:**

- ◆ To those who are a **current NWDA member AND have been a member for at least the current membership year at the time of application** (current family membership is acceptable if under 18 years old at application deadline).
- ◆ To those who are of Danish descent, or married to someone of Danish descent, and have actively participated in the Danish community and/or show an interest in perpetuating their Danish heritage. Consideration will also be given to those of non-Danish descent who have shown exceptional involvement or interest in the Danish community.
- ◆ To those who reside in the states of Oregon or Washington.
- ◆ For use in seeking academic degrees, vocational degrees, re-training for employment possibilities, or training for legitimate artistic careers that enrich and/or entertain.
- ◆ With preference given to applicants who have actively participated in the Danish community and show an interest in perpetuating their Danish heritage.

**Scholarship Renewal**

Scholarship recipients may request renewal of their awards by applying to the NWDA Scholarship Committee. Renewal applicants must submit an updated application based on the most recent college year, a new statement of educational goals and career goals, updated financial statement, a current official transcript, and references from a recent teacher.
