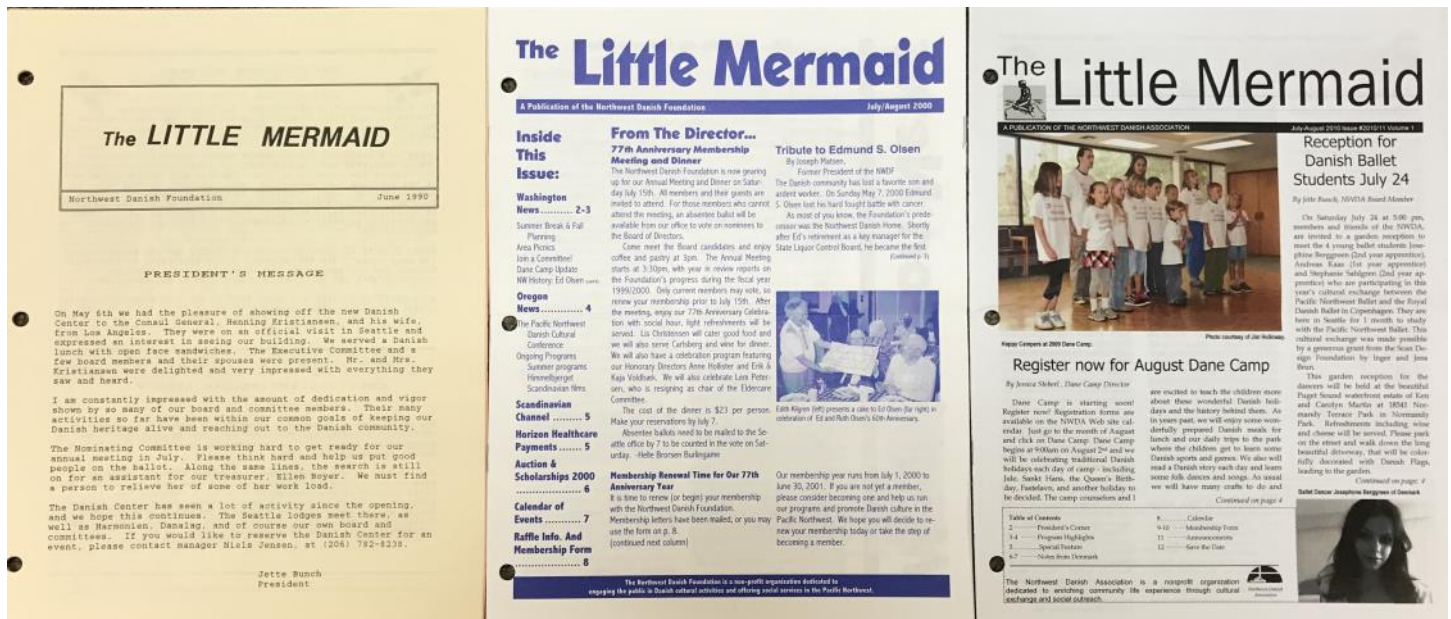


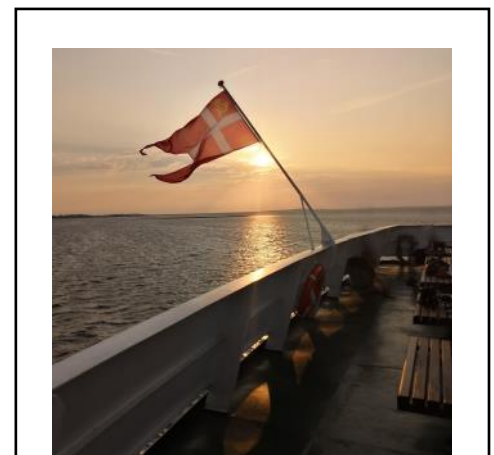
Image: The Little Mermaid from decade to decade—Year 1990 (left), 2000 (center), 2010 (right)

The Northwest Danish Association has existed in some form for nearly 100 years. First as the Northwest Danish Home, then the Northwest Danish Foundation, and currently as the Northwest Danish Association. Whatever its name, the organization has always striven to enrich the Danish community of the Pacific Northwest. I thought it would be fun to dive into the archives of The Little

Mermaid to see what we were doing 10, 20, and 30 years ago.

The first thing I noticed was how the look of The Little Mermaid has changed in 30 years. We have paper copies of almost every Little Mermaid going back to 1987. Those of the late 80s and early 90s are on colored paper with simple fonts and

It has been exciting to see the interest in the language classes. With Zoom, people did not have to travel anywhere but could participate in the comfort of their home. With Danish language classes both in Seattle and Portland and at different times, we could offer a time for anyone. We have had beginners to advanced students, teen agers and others wanting to learn the language of their parents and those who need to practice to stay fluent.

Our work for the next year is going to take us to uncharted territory. How will we continue to provide programs to people no matter where they live? How will we combine the two so people can either be present in person or online and yet participate? Keep tuned as we plan our events.

graphics. Those of the late 90s and very early 2000s are completely printed in blue ink, but have wonderful pictures of our events and members. Once we get into the 00s they were printed in black and white or eventually in full color. Once The Little Mermaid went primarily digital, full color was a more feasible option.

The focus of The Little Mermaid has changed as well. Originally it was purely a newsletter meant to keep our members connected and apprised of the goings on in the Pacific Northwest Danish Community. It was filled with event notices, membership updates, and announcements. As time went on, more articles were included that didn't solely focus on the Pacific Northwest, but told of happenings in Denmark from members and other news sources as well.

For a time in my childhood, the 90s and 00s, those blue-ink Little Mermaids were produced every other month. We currently have a new issue each quarter instead, but we haven't lost the importance of keeping our membership up-to-date on all the events and news of the organization. The Little Mermaid is not our primary tool to keep members and the community in general updated on the events. With the e-bulletin out each week and our website and social media presence, we can reach more people more often than ever before.

What we were doing in June of 1990:

- Jette Bunch was President of the Board
- We had just hosted Henning Kristiansen, the Danish Consul General based in Los Angeles, so he could see our new building in Seattle
- University of Washington Extension was about to offer an evening Autumn Quarter program about the Celtic-Scandinavian Legacy
- Mel Pihl wrote an article titled *Dannebrog Fable or Fact* around the time of Dannebrog's 770th Anniversary
- Outreach Oregon had a trip planned to Seattle to visit the Nordic Heritage Museum
- The Danish Immigrant Museum in Elk Horn, Iowa had just voted to start construction on a new building
- The All-Danish Community Picnic was going to be held on July 29th at the Nile Temple Country Club hosted for the first time by 8 Seattle Danish Organizations
- A Danish craft day was held as a mid-day program on Wednesday June 20th and everyone was to bring cookies to share

What we were doing in July/August of 2000:

- Annual Meeting and Dinner was planned and was going to honor Honorary Directors Anne Hollister and Erik & Kaja Voldbæk
- A tribute to Edmund S. Olsen was written by Joseph Matsen since Ed died 5/7/2000 and had been a 42 year board member and director of the home
- The Picnic was planned for July 23rd in Normandy Park
- The *Year of the Viking* was being celebrated at the Nordic Heritage Museum's Tivoli/Viking Days and Elsie Norman was coordinating Danes for the æbleskiver booth
- Dane Camp registration had nearly reached their 30 camper limit
- Himmelbjerget had 64 campers and 15 counselors with a Famous Danes theme
- There was a call to try to get the Scandinavian Channel in the PNW like in Denver
- \$20,000 was raised at the auction, \$15,000 for scholarships and the rest to costs and Elder-care

What we were doing in July/August of 2010:

- Dane Camp to be directed by Jessica Steberl with a Danish Holidays theme
- \$20,000 was raised at Auction and Yina Moe-Lange came and talked about representing Denmark at the 2010 Vancouver Olympics in alpine skiing

When COVID-19 started spreading in the US, the Himmelbjerget committee knew it would impact camp. From the very beginning, we all agreed on one thing, we couldn't just cancel camp. Over the course of several months of Zoom meetings, the counselor team agreed on a plan and started creating content.

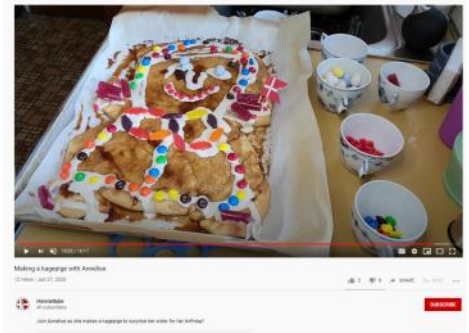

Black Lives Matter—Denmark

Powerful protests have flared up in every U.S. state in the wake of George Floyd's recent death at the hands of Minneapolis police officers. Countless years of deep-rooted racism and senseless deaths of black Americans lie underneath the spur of demonstrations. Now the protests have sparked a 21st century civil rights movement that has spread to other parts of the world, including Denmark.

The movement in Denmark grew exponentially in the first week of June. On May 31st, 2,000 protesters gathered in front of the U.S. Embassy in Copenhagen. In one week, the number of protesters grew 7-fold. On June 7th, over 15,000 people marched through the city and assembled in front of the U.S. Embas-

sy. The BLM movement called Denmark's silence "deafening". Protesters are "[...] demand[ing] that the government speak up against the 'brutality and murders by their close ally the United States' [and] 'root out systemic racism in Denmark and the USA'" (source: The CPH Post <http://cphpost.dk/?p=114599>). Protests were not only confined to the capital. Demonstrations spanned in the major cities across Denmark, including Aalborg, Aarhus, and Odense.

The ardent show of public support behind the BLM movement in Denmark corresponds with values embedded in Danish society. Social justice and equality are fought for and celebrated in Denmark. Yet the

Corona Report From Denmark

Denmark locked down in a big way from the middle of March to the middle of April. My children, who are tweens, went back to school in April. The number of Corona deaths here at the end of March were about 100 per week. At the end of June, it was 4 per week. It is very rare to see someone with a mask on. There have been issues with the sunny weather with people clumping together outside, where the police have had to intervene.

Right now, Denmark is recommending that Danes visit only European countries and vice versa (Romania, Portugal, the United Kingdom, Ireland, Malta and Sweden are not on

the list of recommended countries). If people come to visit from the list of recommended countries, they need to bring documentation that they have booked accommodations for at least six nights in Denmark.

Since the Corona crisis started, there has been an increase of the amount of unemployed from about 130,000 to 175,000 people. Stores and the travel industry have been especially hard hit.

There have been some creative ways to deal with the isolation that makes us more safe from the virus. There have been drive-in music concerts where people honk and use their windshield wipers for applause. I “went” to a live discussion about how to find solutions to Danish agriculture’s dependence on animals and how to decrease meat, egg, and dairy production. This was done online with Zoom. A popular program on Danish TV is “Morgensang med Phillip Faber”, where the audience at home sings along together but separate, like a “hyggelig” karaoke.

In supermarkets, it is recommended to only have one person shop per family. Also it is recommended to try to avoid cash to help cut down on the possibility of contagion.
