I will be happy to set up the zoom meetings (that will not be recorded or available on a website), and I hope we can spend some time deciding which books we will want to read and discuss – maybe even make a plan for the entire season.

While there is no obligation to participate, it would be nice with a smidgeon of commitment so we are always sure of some people showing up for the discussion!

I suggest we stay with the second Tuesday every month at 7 pm Central Time – as that is what we have gotten used to, so it should be easy to remember.

Since we have not had a full discussion of books, I am taking the liberty of suggesting a book by the Danish/Norwegian author Amalie Skram, *Betrayed*. It has the beauty of being both very interesting, well written, and quite short – and I have it as a PDF file that I will be happy to share with whomever would like to participate in the discussion.

So, to conclude: THANK YOU for your interest, DO send me an email indicating your desire to continue, if you haven't already done so, and DO let me know if you would like me to send you the PDF file with the book.
